Be it enacted by the Village Board of the Village of TURIN as follows:

Section 1. Title

This local law shall be referred to as a "local law imposing a 6-month extension of the current Moratorium, known as Local Law No. 01 of 2025, on the acceptance or approval of applications for permits authorizing the construction or emplacement of certain solar energy collectors, generators or battery storage facilities as non-accessory uses in all zoning districts within the village boundaries.

Section 2. Definitions

SOLAR ENERGY GENERATOR OR COLLECTOR -For purposes of this Local Law, the term "solar energy generator or collector" shall mean the activity of creating electricity as an alternate energy source from sunlight. As used in this law the term includes all of the infrastructure, equipment and accessories used in the processing and battery storage of sunlight into useable power with a capacity of 25 kilowatts (kw) The term does not include solar energy generation or collection as an accessory use to an existing residential, commercial or industrial structure; or installations up to 24.99 kw.

BATTERY ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEM – One or more devices, assembled, capable of storing energy to supply electrical energy at a future time, not to include a stand-alone 12-volt car battery or an electric motor vehicle. A battery energy storage system is classified as a Tier 1 or Tier 2 Battery Energy Storage System as follows:

- A. Tier 1 Battery Energy Storage Systems have an aggregate energy capacity less than or equal to 600kWh and, if in a room or enclosed area, consist of only a single energy storage system technology.
- B. Tier 2 Battery Energy Storage Systems have an aggregate energy capacity greater than 600kWh or are comprised of more than one storage battery technology in a room or enclosed area.

COMMERCIAL ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEMS – are defined, for the purpose of this local law, as any rechargeable energy storage system consisting of electrochemical storage batteries, battery chargers, controls, power conditioning systems, and associated electrical equipment designated to store and provide electrical power primarily off site or for commercial purposes. Any installations by, or undertaken on behalf of individual landowners, householders, businesses or farmer, primarily for personal, residential and onsite use shall not be considered a commercial Energy Storage System and shall be specifically exempted from this moratorium.

COMPRESSED AIR ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEM – A system where a compressed air energy storage plant can compress air and store the compressed air in a cavern underground. At times when

demand is high, the stored air can be released, and the energy can be utilized during peak demand times.

PERSON - For the purposes of this local law, the term "person" shall include an individual, society, club, firm, partnership, joint venture, corporation, or the association of persons, and the singular shall include the plural number.

VILLAGE - For the purposes of this local law, the term "Village" shall mean the Village of TURIN.

VILLAGE BOARD. PLANNING BOARD, and ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS - For the purposes of this local law, the term "Village Board", "Planning Board", and "Zoning Board of Appeals" shall refer to the respective boards established in and for the Village of TURIN.

Section 3. Purpose and Intent

Pursuant to the statutory powers vested in the Village of TURIN to regulate and control land use and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of its residents, the Village Board of the Village of TURIN declares a one year moratorium on the acceptance or approval of applications for permits authorizing the construction or emplacement of solar energy collectors or generators as non-accessory uses in all zoning districts, as well as a moratorium on any activity associated therewith or intending to support such process including the establishment, implementation, placement, or construction of associated infrastructure or similar activity in the Village of TURIN.

Section 4. Legislative Findings

A. The Village finds that there may be an increase in the demand for this type of solar energy generator or collector in the Village and that it may receive a number of new applications for, and inquiries about, the establishment or enlargement of energy producing activity within the Village.

B. The question of integrating such energy production facilities of within the Village's existing pattern of predominately residential and agricultural land use emphasizes the need for suitable siting, land use standards with reference to energy production facilities, consistent with applicable provisions of law.

C. The Village Board of the Village of TURIN desires to address, in a careful manner, this integration question on a comprehensive Village-wide basis, rather than on an ad hoc basis, and to adopt Local Law provisions to properly regulate the same.

Section 5. Scope and Controls

A. For the period of one year following the effective date of this local law, no permits requesting approval for non-accessory solar energy generators or collectors as herein defined shall be accepted or approved by any officer or board of the Village of TURIN.

B. During the effective period of this Local Law:

1. The Village Board shall not consider and/or approve any site plan, approve any special use permit or other permit authorizing the construction or emplacement of solar energy collectors or generators as herein defined in all zoning districts within the Village.

2. The Village Zoning Board of Appeals shall not consider and/or grant any variance, special use permit or other permit authorizing the construction or emplacement of solar energy collectors or generators as herein defined in all zoning districts within the Village.

3. The Zoning or Codes Enforcement Officer of the Village; shall not consider or issue any building permit or other permit authorizing the construction or emplacement of solar energy collectors or generators as herein defined in all zoning districts within the Village.

C. If, within one year, the Village Board adopts a local law relating to the construction or emplacement of solar energy collectors or generators as herein defined, the moratorium imposed by this local law shall expire immediately on the date the local law relating to the construction or emplacement of solar energy collectors or generators as non-accessory uses takes effect in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Section 6. Exceptions

This local law shall not apply to applications for permits or approvals of solar energy generators or collectors of capacity below 25 kw, or to be installed as any accessory use or structure to an existing residence, commercial, industrial, or agricultural structure.

Section 7. Term

This moratorium shall be in effect for a period of six months from the date of this Local Law.

Section 8. Violations

Any person violating any of the provisions of this local law shall be guilty of an offense and upon a conviction thereof, be given a civil penalty of no less than \$5,000.00 and no more than \$10,000.00 per day for this violation. Each day's violation shall constitute a separate and additional violation. An action may be commenced in a court of competent jurisdiction to recover such penalty. In addition, thereto, violations of this local law shall be subject to being restrained by injunctive relief.

Section 9. Conflict with Other Laws

This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the provision of the Village Law and the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York. During the duration of times that this Law is in effect, it shall take precedence over and shall be considered controlling over contrary laws, ordinances and provisions including, but not limited to, the statutes set forth in the New York Town Law related to zoning and subdivision.

Section 10. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, article or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operations to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section, article, or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 11. When Effective

This Local Law shall take effect upon the filing at the New York State Secretary of State's office.





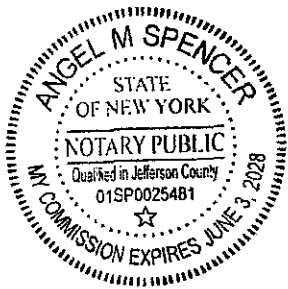
