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Section 1 Overview of the Study

The Goals of this Study

During July and August of 2025 the Lewis County (New York) Department of Planning and Community Development commissioned a community survey study of important issues related to housing in Lewis County, New York. Specifically, this community housing needs assessment study is an attempt to learn adult residents' attitudes, opinions, preferences, and behaviors related to access and affordability of available housing in the county. Affordability and access to housing is not an issue that is unique to Lewis County, New York, but rather, is an important issue to virtually every community. County leadership has been studying the housing issues that residents face for several years, while commissioning multiple studies of available housing stock, market patterns regarding home sales and rentals, and identification and analysis of the financial viability of potential properties that are located in the county that could be repurposed as supportive housing of various types. One key component of this large body of housing-related information and data, that has not yet been studied, however, is public opinion and sentiment.

Therefore, the Lewis County Department of Planning and Community Development contracted with the *Center for Community Studies at SUNY Jefferson Community College* (Watertown, New York) to complete a random and representative survey that included 729 adult residents of the county. The *Center for Community Studies* is a research institute that has over 25 years of survey research experience completing over 200 public opinion research studies on behalf of a wide variety of community-based agencies throughout Northern New York State. Specifically, the survey instrument developed and utilized in this survey study has been designed through a collaborative effort of the professional staffs of each of the Lewis County Department of Planning and Community Development and the *Center for Community Studies*, and resulted with an instrument that included 80 items (not including socio-demographic variables for each participating adult resident) which have been organized into the following six sections of housing-related survey questions:

- 1. Current Housing Situations in Lewis County
- 2. Housing Preferences Among Lewis County Residents
- 3. Current Housing Costs and Affordability in Lewis County
- 4. Opinions Regarding Housing Affordability in Lewis County
- 5. Housing Needs, Challenges, and Insecurity in Lewis County
- 6. Community Housing Development Including Affordable Housing and Supportive Housing in Lewis County

This report is a presentation of the results of the Lewis County (New York) 2025 Community Housing Needs Assessment Adult Community Opinion Survey.

Section 2 Methodology

A mixed-mode survey sampling methodology utilizing all three of: live-interviewer *intercept surveying*, at the Lewis County Fair in Lowville, New York in late July 2025, random *MMS text messaging to cellular phones* with an invitation and link to complete the survey online in the first week of August 2025, and random *email-invitations to a nonprobability panel* with an invitation and link to complete the survey online in the first week of August 2025, were employed in this study with

a total of 729 Lewis County adult residents completing the survey. By sampling mode of contact the number of participants in this study were: 315 by intercept, 244 by MMS text message push-to-web, 170 by email message push-to-web.

All intercept surveys were completed between the hours of 3:00-7:00 pm during evenings of July 15 and July 17, 2025, in Lowville, New York. Incentives of \$10 were offered to each individual when they were asked to complete a survey in person. The online version of the survey was open for one week during early August 2025. No incentives were offered to online participants. To be eligible to complete the survey participants were required to be at least 18 years of age, and a resident of Lewis County. Using this mixed-mode sampling methodology, the resulting participation rates for this study (approximately 90% of all individuals who were offered an opportunity live in-person at the Lewis County Fair completed the survey, approximately 2% of all valid email invitations distributed resulted with completed surveys, approximately 3.5% of all valid MMS text message invitations distributed resulted with completed surveys) are all considered very good among the current industry standards of survey sampling reported by the American Association of Public Opinion Research (AAPOR).

In accordance with the American Association of Public Opinion Research Transparency Initiative pledge, the following details and disclosure for the *intercept-interviewing and online surveying* employed in this study, including the following characteristics and facts, should be considered by any reader:

1. (T) Dates of Data Collection: July 15, 2025 through August 8, 2025.

2. (R) Recruitment:

Intercept: All face-to-face participants were recruited at the parade and on the fairgrounds, both associated

with the annual Lewis County Fair in Lowville, New York on the evenings of July 15th and 17th, 2025.

Online (email): Participants were recruited to participate via an email invitation to a nonprobability panel with

a link to the survey embedded.

Online (MMS): Participants were recruited to participate via an MMS text message invitation with a link to

the survey embedded.

3. (A) Population Under Study: All adult residents of Lewis County, New York, USA. There are approximately 26,000

residents in the county. Approximately 20,000 of the 26,000 residents are adults, it

is these adults who are the population of interest in this study.

4. (N) List Source: Intercept: No list utilized

Online (email): Bulk Email Superstore, Aristotle, L2, and DataAxle.

Online (MMS): L2, Electronic Voice Services, Inc., www.voice-boards.com, and Aristotle.

5. (S) Sampling Design:

Intercept: Adults who attended the Lewis County Fair the on July 15 or July 17, 2025 and who were encountered by 12 intercept-interviewers employed by the *Center for Community Studies*, were

each invited to participate. 315 surveys were completed by intercepted participants.

Online (email): The entire email address list described in #4 was randomized, and approximately 8,000 email

addresses of adult residents of Lewis County, NY were selected to contact to invite to participate in the survey. 170 surveys were completed by participants who were recruited by

email push-to-web.

Online (MMS): The entire cellular phone number list described in #4 was randomized, and approximately

8,000 cellular phones of adult residents of Lewis County, NY were selected to contact via MMS to invite to participate in the survey. 244 surveys were completed by participants who

were recruited by MMS push-to-web.

6. (P) Population Sampling Frame:

Intercept: All adult residents of Lewis County, New York, USA.

Online (email): As described in #5, the sampling frame includes all available nonprobability panel email

addresses of adult residents of Lewis County, New York, USA.

Online (MMS): As described in #5, the sampling frame includes all available cellular phone numbers of adult

residents of Lewis County, New York, USA.

7. **(A)** Administration:

Intercept: Survey administered face-to-face at the Lewis County Fair, Lowville, New York, USA, only in

English. Participants were offered a \$10 food gift certificate redeemable immediately at food

vendors at the Fair.

Online (email): Survey administered online via an email invitation to a nonprobability panel, only in English,

using Momentive. No incentives or rewards were offered to participants.

Online (MMS): Survey administered online via an MMS invitation, only in English, using Momentive. No

incentives or rewards were offered to participants.

8. **(R)** Researchers: The study has been completed by the Center for Community Studies at Jefferson Community College (SUNY), in collaboration with the Lewis County (New York) Department of Planning

and Community Development, with funding provided by the Board of Legislature of Lewis County, New York, USA

- 9. (E) Exact Wording of Survey: The survey instrument is attached as Appendix II.
- 10. (N) Sample Sizes: As is discussed in much greater detail for this study later in this report: n=729 overall for the study, with an overall average margin of error of ±3.3%, including the design effect due to weighting. Again, by sampling modality employed in this study, the raw sample sizes are: 244 online surveys via MMS push-to-web; 170 online surveys via email invitations to a nonprobability panel; and 315 intercept surveys at the annual Lewis County Fair.
- 11. **(C)** Calculation of Weights: As is discussed in much greater detail for this study later in this report, community housing needs survey results are weighted by gender, age, educational attainment, home-ownership, household composition (children in home), and geography (the design effect in this study is approximately 1.32). Target weighting parameters for demographic characteristics are obtained from the U.S. Census.
- 12. (Y) Contact Information: Mr. Joel LaLone, Director, Center for Community Studies, contact information on page 4.

Table 1, spanning the next two pages, summarizes the socio-demographic, geographic, and housing-related characteristics of the sample of 729 adult participants who were surveyed employing the described methodology. This information facilitates readers' abilities to observe the representativeness of the study sample, as well further learn local-level information regarding the many variables that will subsequently be used as independent/explanatory variables in correlative investigations. These investigations will involve in attempts to identify the variables that are most strongly linked to opinions, attitudes, and behaviors regarding housing in the county.

Generalizability and the Margin of Error – Constructing Confidence Intervals

If the group of 729 Lewis County adult residents who completed surveys as a part of this study is considered as a sample that represents the population of all adult residents of the county, then the data reported in this study for **the entire group of n=729 participants will have an average margin of error of approximately ±3.3%**, using a 95% confidence level. If investigating the results for subgroups (for example, only the subgroup of residents who are under the age of 40) then the margins of error will be larger due to smaller individual within-subgroup sample sizes.

Note that technically there is not one universal value of a margin of error that can be precisely calculated and used for the results for every question included in this survey, or for that matter, any multiple-question survey. Calculation

methods used for generating a very precise measurement of the margin of error depend upon four factors. (1) The sample size is the number of participants who validly answered the survey question. In general, the smaller the sample size the larger the margin of error, and conversely, the larger the sample size the smaller the margin of error. (2) The sample proportion or percentage is the calculated percentage of the sample who responded with the answer or category of interest. This percentage can vary from 0%-100%, and, of course, will change from question to question throughout the survey. In general, the further that a sample percentage varies from 50%, in either direction (approaching either 0% or 100%), the smaller the margin of error, and conversely, the closer that the actual sample percentage is to 50% then the larger the resulting margin of error. (3) The *confidence level* used in generalizing the results of the sample to the population that the sample represented. In this study, the standard confidence level used in survey research, 95% confidence level, will be used for all survey questions. (4) The *design effect* (DEFF) is a factor used in the calculation of the margin of error that compensates for the impact upon the size of the margin of error that having a sample whose demographic distributions do not well-parallel the distributions of the entire population that the sampling is attempting to represent. In general, the further that the sample demographic distributions deviate from the population distributions then the larger the margin of error, and conversely, the closer that the sample demographic distributions parallel the population distributions then the smaller the margin of error. Essentially the design effect reflects the magnitude of the impact that reliance upon weighting of sample results will have upon the reliability of population estimates. The design effect for this study is approximately 1.32.

In mathematical notation, the margin of error (ME) for each sample result for this study would be represented as:

Since participant subgroups of different sample size will be investigated throughout this report, and the sample percentage varies throughout this study (could conceivably be different for *every* question included in the survey) the following table (Table 2 on the following page) has been provided for the reader to determine the correct margin of error to use whenever constructing a confidence interval using the sample data presented in this study. This table was generated using the ME formula shown above.

As an example of how to use Table 2, how would one determine the appropriate margin of error to estimate the percentage in the entire population of all Lewis County adults who are *not at all* concerned "with the issue of homelessness in Lewis County"? One must simply refer to Table 29 later in this report to observe that 23.7% of the 697 sampled adults who completed this survey question replied with "not at all concerned". Reference to Table 2 above indicates that the appropriate margin of error would be ±3.6% (used p=24%, the closest to 23.7% that is shown in Table 2; and used n=729, the closest to 697 that is included in Table 2). Therefore, we can be 95% confident that if <u>all</u> adults in the county were to indicate their level of concern with homelessness in Lewis County, the resulting percentage who would indicate "not at all concerned" among this population of all adults would be within ±3.6% of the 23.7% found in our sample. The interpretation of this would be that we are 95% confident that among <u>all</u> Lewis County adults the percentage who respond with "not at all concerned with the issue of homelessness" would be somewhere between 20.1% and 27.3%. Note that this margin of error of 3.6 percentage points is larger than the earlier-cited study margin of error of approximately 3.3 percentage points as a result of the sample proportion of 23.7% not being extremely far away from 50%. Also, please note that readers who desire a greater level of accuracy than this estimated margin of error that has been excerpted from Table 2 may directly calculate the exact margin of error using p=23.7, n=697, and DEFF=1.32, in the ME formula shown on the preceding page.

Finally, the margin error is a measurement of random error, error due to simply the random chance of sampling such as when randomly flipping fair coins. However, in survey research, it is not coins that are being flipped; it is humans who are being interviewed. When surveying humans there are other potential sources of error, sources of error in addition to random error (which is the only error encompassed by the margin of error). Response error, nonresponse error, process error, bias in sample selection, bias in question-phrasing, lack of clarity in question-phrasing, social desirability bias,

acquiescence bias, satisficing, interviewer process error, and undercoverage are potential additional sources of other-thanrandom error. Methods that should be, and have been in this Lewis County study, employed to minimize these other
sources of error are: maximum effort to select the sample randomly, piloting and testing of utilized survey questions, training
of all data collectors, thorough cleansing of data, calibration of data when necessary, and application and trimming of poststratification algorithms to the resulting sampled data when necessary. Hence, when using this study data to make
estimates to the entire population of Lewis County adults, as is the case in standard survey research practices, the margin
of error will be the only error measurement cited and interpreted.

The statistics reported in the correlative tables and correlative graphs throughout the remainder of this report (cross-tabulations by socio-demographic, geographic, and housing-related potential explanatory variables) are typically percentages within the sampled <u>subgroups</u>. To determine the raw unweighted sample size for each subgroup – to avoid over-interpretation – the reader should refer to the bottom row of each cross-tabulation table provided in Appendix I of this report. In summary, these unweighted within-subgroup sample sizes are also provided in the following Table 3. Again, all study findings should be considered with sample sizes in mind. Statistical tests of significance take into consideration and reflect these varying sample sizes. The typical sample size within each demographic subgroup in this Lewis County study is shown, along with the appropriate approximate margin of error for each of these subgroup sample sizes, in the following table. Please note that of course the subgroups that are smaller in size (such as only the subgroup of *only those participants who identify their political ideology as "liberal"*) will have a larger margin of error that should be applied when attempting to estimate outcomes for these subgroups – therefore, extreme caution should be used when generalizing small subgroup results.

Statistical Significance Tests

A. Correlated Explanatory Variables – How does one decide if there is a "statistically significant" correlation?

How does one determine if the observed difference in rates (or, percentages) when comparing subgroups is large enough to be statistically significant, or so small that it is not statistically significant? The rule that should be applied to determine statistical significance is:

- 1. Sample percentages in the same row and subtable (comparing demographic subgroups) <u>not sharing</u> the same subscript <u>are</u> significantly different at p< .05.
- 2. Sample percentages in the same row and subtable (comparing demographic subgroups) <u>sharing</u> the same subscript <u>are not</u> significantly different at p< .05.

All tests for variables that possess a categorically-defined response distribution have been completed using the two-proportion z-test. Subsequent cell adjustment for all pairwise comparisons within a row of each innermost sub-table using the Bonferroni Multiple Comparison corrections has been completed when necessary. Tests assume equal variances. All results for all significance tests are reported in the associated cross-tabulation contingency tables using APA-style subscripts.

For example, the Socio-demographic Factors cross-tabulation table for the question in this survey "How concerned are you with the issue of homelessness in Lewis County?" is shown below (and, also later in this report this is from Table 29, and Table 29.XTAB):

The cross-tabulation table above shows that 32.8% of *male participants* respond with "not at all concerned", while the rate for *females* decreases to 15.0%. Since these two percentages do not share a subscript (the males have a subscript of "a", and the females have a subscript of "b"), the difference between these two subgroups is statistically significant when comparing the rates of responding "not at all concerned". The rates of responding "not at all concerned" when comparing the two gender subgroups are far enough apart to be tremendously unlikely to happen due to the random chance of sampling if the two genders are, in fact, not different in their opinions. Therefore, the observed sample difference is considered statistically significant. The above-described process is the appropriate process to use whenever comparing subgroups within the data set that have been collected and analyzed in this study. Note, using the same rules outlined above – residents of different ages do not differ statistically significantly in their likelihood to respond "not at all concerned" since all five reported age subgroups possess the subscript of "a". However, likelihood to respond "not at all concerned" is statistically significantly associated with education level of the participants, with the most highly educated significantly less likely to respond "not at all concerned" (only 12.5%, and a subscript of "b").

Note that there are a small number of numerically-defined, or measured, variables in this study, all of which are measurements of housing costs, with units of US dollars (either monthly costs such as rent, or annual costs such as property

taxes). Correlative analyses for all of these numerically-measured variables have also been completed and reported in the appendix of this study. Statistically significant differences between subgroups for these numerical variables are reported in tabular format similarly as to the way that the preceding examples have described, where sample means in the same row and subtable (comparing demographic subgroups) not sharing the same subscript being significantly different at p<0.05, while sample means in the same row and subtable sharing the same subscript not being significantly different at p<0.05. However, the mathematics required to complete these types of statistical tests for numerical response variables are not exactly the same as the pairwise comparison tests described above. Two-sample t-tests have been completed for all numerical response variable comparison tests.

B. Comparing similarly-scaled variables (survey items) – How does one determine whether two different survey question distributions differ "statistically significantly" from one another?

The same concept of statistical significance that has been described in the preceding pages regarding "Correlational" Analyses" is also applied when a researcher attempts to investigate whether or not a difference observed between two similarly-measured items is statistically significant. The focus now becomes the comparison of the level of attitude, or support, or experience, or whatever is measured for various similarly-scaled survey items ... for example, is there statistically significantly more (or less) level of support for certain Lewis County housing policies and programs than others? First, the reader must identify the specific response choice of interest, and the sample percentage for that response among the collected sample. For example, is one interested in only investigating "Strongly Support", or is one more interested in collapsing the two possible level-of-agreement response choices of "Strongly" and "Somewhat" together into a response choice group that could be referred to as "Support"? Next, one may refer to Table 2 in this study to identify the correct approximate margins of error (or directly calculate these margins of error with more accuracy and precision using the ME formula shown earlier) if estimating proportions (or, "percentages" or "rates") for differing survey questions that are measured on the same scale. With these margins of error, two separate confidence intervals may be constructed, one for each survey item, then the technique that is recommended in this study to determine whether a statistically significant difference is present is to apply the following method that has also been recommended by the New York State Department of Health in its presentation of the Expanded Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS). The NYSDOH 2009 Expanded BRFSS (on page 12 of 151 in that report) cites the following:

"When the confidence intervals of two estimates of the same indicator from different areas (or, subgroups) do not overlap, they may be said to be statistically significantly different, i.e., these differences are unlikely related to chance and are considered true differences. If there is any value that is included in both intervals, the two estimates are not statistically significantly different."

To summarize, first the reader must identify the specific response choice of interest and the current sample percentage for that response. Then, after observing the sample sizes for the survey questions to be compared, one may refer to Table 2 in this study to identify the correct *approximate* margins of error. With these margins of error, two separate confidence intervals may be constructed, one for each similarly-scaled variable, and the overlap-vs-non-overlap rule recommended above by the NYSDOH may be applied to determine whether or not the observed sample difference between different similarly-scaled variables should be considered statistically significant. This technique for testing for statistical significance does include the design effect in measuring the standard error and margin of error.

To illustrate a comparison of level of support for two different Lewis County housing policies and programs, please consider the following two survey items among participants in this study, both similarly measured on a Very/Somewhat/A Little/Not At All importance scale: *How important is more support in homeowner improvement funding?* (Table 32) and *How important is more support in ADU development?* (Table 35). For this example, rates of responding "Very or Somewhat" important will be compared.

"How important is more support in homeowner improvement funding?"

from Table 32, n=687 participants and p=74.6% responded "Very or Somewhat Important"; therefore from Table 2 the approximate margin of error is ±3.7%. The resulting confidence interval for "Very or Somewhat Important" is: 74.6%±3.7%, or (70.9%,78.3%).

"How important is more support in ADU development?"

from Table 35, n=686 participants and p=51.6% responded "Very or Somewhat Important"; therefore from Table 2 the approximate margin of error is ±4.2%. The resulting confidence interval for "Very or Somewhat Important" is: 51.6%±4.2%, or (47.4%,55.8%).

Since these two confidence intervals <u>do not</u> overlap, the difference in level of perceived importance for "more support in homeowner improvement funding" (74.6% at least somewhat important) and for "more support in ADU development" (51.6% at least somewhat important) among Lewis County adults <u>is</u> considered statistically significant. In

other words, based upon the sample data collected in this survey study, the perceived importance of more support for homeowner improvement funding is significantly higher than the perceived importance of more support for ADU development in Lewis County.

If one is interested in a statistical test that compares two similarly-scaled response variables that are both numerically defined (in \$ in this study), then they are encouraged to contact the professional staff of the *Center for Community Studies* to complete and report this more complex type of modeling.

Finally, the preceding comments regarding statistically significant differences between subgroups, and statistically significant differences between similarly-scaled variables are comments addressing *statistical* significance ... which, of course, is not one-and-the-same as *practical* significance. The reader is reminded that statistical significance with respect to sample differences found addresses the concept of *probability*, as follows – "is this difference likely to occur in a sample of size n≈729 (or, in the case of subgroups, samples of less than 729, at times) *if there is no difference in the entire sampled populations*... or could the result simply be due to chance?" However, practical significance is an interpretation that is left to the subject area expert, since practical significance addresses the concept of *usefulness*, as follows – "is this difference identified in the collected data useful in the real world?" A *difference* identified in a sample (or, samples) may be statistically significant without being practically significant, however, a *difference* identified in a sample (or, samples) may *not* be practically significant without being statistically significant. To summarize, readers are warned not to over-interpret some practical significance or meaning for a difference in this study data that is mathematically deemed to be *not* statistically significant.

Section 3 Detailed Results of Study Findings

NOTE REGARDING ORGANIZATION OF SECTION 3:

Section 3.0

The Topline Summary of Study Findings presents results graphically for the entire study sample for each of the questions in each of the six sections of the survey instrument, along with narrative descriptions of key data-driven observations. These graphical presentations facilitate the opportunity for the reader to draw conclusions based upon within-response-distribution comparisons and ratios, as well as compare results for similarly-scaled survey variables to identify relative intensities. Extrapolation from measured and presented percentages among the sample distributions to generate estimated counts among the population of adults among Lewis County residents is also facilitated by these topline graphical presentations. The observations and findings highlighted in Section 3.0, however, *do not* address any subgroup analyses (cross-tabulations).

Section 3.1 – Section 3.6


Sections 3.1-3.6 provide much more Detailed Results for each housing-related survey question included in this study. These six sections present unweighted frequencies and weighted percentages for each individual survey question included in this study in tabular format. Further, cross-tabulation results for each survey question are illustrated graphically. These detailed cross-tabulated results are very expansive, and include cross-tabulated subgroup comparisons by 19 separate potential explanatory (or, correlated) variables, that encompass 61 different subgroups of county adult participants. These 19 explanatory variables have been Socio-demographic (11 variables, including gender, age, separated into three subgroups: education, annual income, poverty, household composition, children in the home, disability status, employment, longevity living in the county, and political ideology), Geographic (2 variables, region of residence in the county, and Legislative district of residence), and Housingrelated (6 variables, including current housing type, home-ownership, difficulty finding housing, fear of losing housing, experiences with being homeless, level of concern with homelessness locally). To determine which of these observable subgroup differences from the crosstabulation graphs are statistically significant differences, these correlative results are also presented in much more detailed tabular format in Appendix I, with statistical tests applied and results reported.

Topline Summary of Study Findings

Section 3.0.1

Current Housing Situations in Lewis County




A large majority of Lewis County adult residents (86%) indicate that they currently reside in a single-family home, while only 8% report living in an apartment, and only 6% report living in a mobile home. (Table 4)


<u>NOTE:</u> To determine which socio-demographic, geographic, and/or housing-related survey questions, or variables, may or may not be associated with the current housing situations reported for this entire sample of n=729 participants that is illustrated above in Figure 1, readers are directed to Section 3.1 in this report, as well as Appendix I for statistical significance. The subgroup analyses (cross-tabulations) for <u>every</u> county-wide aggregate result reported in this Section 3.0 Topline Summary are also shown in Section 3.1 and Appendix I.

Section 3.0.2


Housing Preferences Among Lewis County Residents



A large majority of Lewis County adult residents (90%) indicate that they prefer to live in a single-family home, while only 8% report to prefer living in an apartment, and only 3% report prefer living in a mobile home. Three-fourths of Lewis County residents prefer living in a more rural setting, outside of a village. Regarding size of preferred homes, the most common number of bedrooms that residents ideally would have in their home is three (45% of participants choose this), while only about one-in-four residents (27%) report to prefer two or fewer bedrooms, and 28% prefer four or more bedrooms. The most common number of bathrooms that residents ideally would have in their home is two (64% of participants choose this), while only about one-in-five residents (20%) report to prefer less than two bathrooms, and 17% prefer more than two bathrooms. 
Participants were provided with a list of eight separate characteristics of housing and asked to indicate how important each characteristic is to them in their housing choices. Clearly the two characteristics "broadband/high-speed Internet access" (75% rated as very important), and "yard space" (70% rated as very important), are rated as the most important characteristics of housing among Lewis County residents. 
Lewis County adult residents most commonly indicate that they are not at all interested in Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU's), with 63% not at all interested in living in or becoming a tenant at an ADU in the county, and 60% not at all interested in creating an ADU at their home in Lewis County to rent out and make additional income. However, the alternative suggestion from these survey results is that there is non-negligible level of interest expressed for each of these studied ADU situations, with 19% of residents (almost one-in-five) expressing that they are at least somewhat interested in living in or becoming a tenant at an ADU (7% very interested, and another 12% somewhat interested), and 20% (one-in-five) expressing that they are at least somewhat interested in creating an ADU at their home in Lewis County to rent out and make additional income (8% very interested, and another 12% somewhat interested). Section 3.0.3

Current Housing Costs and Affordability in Lewis County



Participants were asked their current housing situation – **are they renters or do they occupy a home that they own?** Approximately one-in-five adults in Lewis County report to be renters (20%). Among the remaining 80% who report to be home-owners, participants are more likely to be paying a mortgage on their home (43%), rather than living in a home where they have paid off the mortgage (37%). (Table 20)



To better understand current costs of living in Lewis County, participants were asked to estimate various current costs associated with housing.

Renters were asked the following three housing costs (with results shown):

What is your rent cost per month? (Mean=\$714, Median=\$700)

What is your heat/electric average cost per month? (Mean=\$131, Median=\$100)

What is your Internet access cost per month? (Mean=\$68, Median=\$75)

The combined estimate of these three monthly housing costs is that the mean housing cost among renters monthly in Lewis County is \$922 (with a median cost monthly of \$900). (Table 21)

Similarly, residents who own the home in which they reside were asked to estimate various current costs associated with housing. Results are shown separately for those who are still paying a mortgage on the home, versus those who do not pay a mortgage.

Home-owners in Lewis County who are still paying a mortgage were asked the following six housing costs (with results shown):

What is your mortgage each month? (Mean=\$1,014, Median=\$900)

What is your heat/electric average cost per month? (Mean=\$404, Median=\$250)

What is your Internet access cost per month? (Mean=\$105, Median=\$100)

What is your homeowners insurance cost per year? (Mean=\$1,293, Median=\$1,200) (Monthly mean=\$108)

What are your property taxes annually? (Mean=\$3,270, Median=\$3,000) (Monthly mean=\$273)

What is your maintenance/repairs cost in a typical year? (Mean=\$2,524, Median=\$2,000) (Monthly mean=\$210) The combined estimate of these six housing costs is that the mean overall monthly housing cost among home-owners in Lewis County who are paying a mortgage is \$2,103 (with a median cost monthly of \$1,886). (Table 22)

Home-owners in Lewis County who are no longer paying a mortgage were asked the following five housing costs (with results shown):

What is your heat/electric average cost per month? (Mean=\$462, Median=\$200)


What is your Internet access cost per month? (Mean=\$95, Median=\$85)

What is your homeowners insurance cost per year? (Mean=\$1,255, Median=\$1,000) (Monthly mean=\$105)

What are your property taxes annually? (Mean=\$3,265, Median=\$3,000) (Monthly mean=\$272)

What is your maintenance/repairs cost in a typical year? (Mean=\$2,024, Median=\$1,500) (Monthly mean=\$169) The combined estimate of these five housing costs is that the mean overall monthly housing cost among home-owners in Lewis County who are not paying a mortgage is \$1,011 (with a median cost monthly of \$817). 
Section 3.0.4 Opinions Regarding Housing Affordability in Lewis County




Lewis County residents were asked three items regarding their personal opinion of local housing affordability and their knowledge of, and interest in, local affordable housing programs. A majority of residents express concern with housing affordability in the county with 22% describing local housing as very unaffordable, and another 35% feeling that it is a little unaffordable, while only 3% of residents feel that housing is very affordable. Residents are almost three times more likely to indicate that they would not be willing to pay a premium for energy-efficient, or sustainable housing as they are to indicate that they would be willing to pay (37% versus 14%, respectively), however, the most common response is that residents indicate that they would need more details (49% responded "It depends"). There clearly is opportunity in the county for improvement in disseminating information about programs in place to help residents with housing affordability, programs such as Section 8 and subsidized housing, with only one-in-six (16%) of residents responding that they are very familiar with local housing affordability programs (have heard of them and know what they offer). Section 3.0.5

Housing Needs, Challenges, and Insecurity in Lewis County




Approximately one-in-seven Lewis County adult residents (13%) have **recently had difficulty finding suitable housing** (8% recently but not now, 5% currently experiencing difficulty). One-in-five adults in the county (20%) have **recently feared losing their housing** (14% recently but not now, 6% currently fearful). One-in-twelve participants (8%) **have been homeless at some point in time** (homeless is defined as lack of fixed, regular, and adequate night-time residence) with 1% currently homeless and another 7% having been homeless at some point in the past but not now. The **largest housing challenges** that adults report in Lewis County are housing prices, followed by high rents, and interest rates. **Lewis County residents express concern with the issue of homelessness in the county**, with only one-fourth of participants (24%) responding that they are "not at all concerned". (Tables 26-30)




Four potential Lewis County housing policies or programs were posed to participants to identify which policies or programs are perceived as most, versus least, important on which the County should focus. Lewis County adults show majority support, and very little opposition for all four studied potential housing policies or programs. "More support in homeowner improvement funding" is perceived as most important (74% rate as at least somewhat important, while only 7% feel this is not at all important), while "More support in Accessory Dwelling Unit development (small, independent homes on the same property as single-family homes)" is perceived as the least important (51% rate as at least somewhat important, while 15% feel this is not at all important). Section 3.0.6

Community Housing Development – Including Affordable Housing and Supportive Housing in Lewis County




Among 13 different types of housing that could be further developed in Lewis County, the three types of housing that emerge as perceived as most important to develop among current residents are single-family homes, low-income housing, and various types of senior housing. Residents overwhelmingly believe that affordable housing is important to the overall health and well-being of communities (61% respond with very important, and 86% respond at least somewhat important), and by almost a four-to-one ratio are far more likely to support that the County should play a leading role and provide expertise and support in promoting affordable housing locally, rather than staying out of it and letting private developers solve local housing issues (62% versus only 17%, respectively). In the previous 2022 Lewis County Housing Needs Assessment study, it was identified that a wide range of housing is in high need in the county. In 2025, when asked their current opinion of this finding, adult **residents overwhelmingly support** the development of additional housing options that are accessible and attainable for residents across a range of incomes in the county. By approximately a ten-to-one ratio, residents are more likely to support, rather than oppose, this type of affordable housing development in the future (65%-69% support, depending on region in the county where the

development would occur, while only approximately 6% oppose, regardless of whether the development is in the Norther, Central, or Southern regions in the county). (Tables 39-42)



By a tremendous degree, Lewis County adult residents are far more likely to support rather than oppose Human Services agencies in the county making efforts to increase local supportive housing that would include permanent apartments for people who need tailored support services to live independently (69% support versus only 8% oppose). Similarly, Lewis County adult residents express support for supportive housing that would involve temporary housing for those who are in need of housing. All eight villages in the county were posed as possible locations for temporary supportive housing and a majority of participants expressed agreement with locating the supportive housing in each of the eight villages that were listed, with the Village of Lowville the clear leading location candidate.
