Local Law No. 7 of the Year 2001

A Local Law Permitting All-Terrain Vehicle Operation on Certain County Roads.
(Insert Title)

Be it enacted by the Lewis County Board of Legislators of the County of Lewis, as follows:

A LOCAL LAW PERMITTING ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE OPERATION ON CERTAIN COUNTY ROADS.

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of Lewis, as follows:

SECTION I. TITLE.

This Local Law shall be known as the "County of Lewis Local Law Permitting All-Terrain Vehicle Operation on Certain County Roads".

SECTION II. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Local Law is to open for travel by all-terrain vehicles certain portions of the County Highway system pursuant to the authority granted in Section 2405 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

SECTION III. DEFINITIONS.

For purposes of this Local Law, the terms hereinafter identified shall have the meanings indicated:

County: County of Lewis

ATV: An all-terrain vehicle, as defined in Section 2281(1) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

SECTION IV. DESIGNATED HIGHWAYS.

The following roads, or portions thereof, are hereby designated as open to travel by ATV's:

Town of Croghan:

1. Belfort Road (County Route No. 10) - .25 miles

A portion of County Route No. 10 from Erie Canal Road to Long Pond Road.

2. Second Road (County Route No. 8) - 4.5 miles

Entire length of County Route No. 8 from the Old State Road to Main Street.

Town of Diana

1. Factory Road (County Route No. 4) - 4.8 miles

Entire length of County Route No. 4 from the County line to New York State Route 3.

2. Hermitage Road (County Route No. 7) - 1.5 miles

Entire length of County Route No. 7 from Hotel Road to New York State Route 3.

3. South Bonaparte Road (County Route No. 5) - .87 miles

Entire length of County Route No. 5 from Park Road to New York State Route 3.

Town of Greig

1. Burdicks Crossing Road (County Route No. 36) - 1.75 miles

Entire length of County Route No. 36 from the Sweeney Road to the Town line.

2. Pine Grove Road (County Route No. 39) - 1.1 miles

A portion of County Route No. 39 from the Odett Road to the Chases Lake Road.

3. Greig Road (County Route No. 40) - 1.5 miles

A portion of County Route No. 40 from the Town line to the Odett Road.

4. Brantingham Road (County Route No. 42) - 1.5 miles

A portion of County Road No. 42 from the VanArnum Road to the Steam Mill Road.

5. Pine Grove Road - Main Street (County Route 39) - 2 miles

A portion of County Route No. 39 from the Odett Road to the Sweeney Road.

Town of Leyden

1. West Road (County Route No. 51) - 1.8 mile

A portion of County Route No. 51 from the Stuckie Road to Town line.

2. East Road (County Route No. 43) - 4.1 miles

A portion of County Route No. 43 from Locust Grove Road to the County Line.

3. Golden Road (County Route No. 54) - .3 miles

A portion of County Route No. 54 from the Fitch Road to the County line.

4. West Road (County Route No. 51) - .1 mile

A portion of County Route No. 51 from the Thayer Hill Road to the Brown Road.

5. West Road (County Route No. 51) - .6 miles

A portion of County Route No. 51 from the Cone Road to Rte. 12D.

Town of Lowville:

1. West Road (County Route No. 29) - 1.5 miles

A portion of County Route 29 from its intersection with State Route 177 to the Gardner Road.

Town of Martinsburg

1. West Road (County Route No. 29) - .75 miles

A portion of County Route No. 29 from the Lee Road to Corrigan Hill Road.

2. Greig Road (County Route No. 40) - .09 miles

A portion of County Route No. 40 from bridge over Black River to Main Street (County Route 41).

3. Main Street (County Route No. 41) - .22 miles

A portion of County Route No. 41 from intersection with County Route No. 40 to Glenfield Road.

4. Glenfield Road (County Route No. 41) - .21 miles

A portion of County Route No. 41 from Main Street to New York State Route 12.

5. Glendale Road (County Route No. 32) - 1.68 miles

A portion of county Route No. 32 from State Rte. 12 to the intersection with the Lee and Tiffany Roads.

6. Houseville Road (County Route No. 34) - .47 miles

A portion of County Route No. 34 from County Route No. 32 to Duncan Road.

Town of Montague

1. Sears Pond Road (County Route No. 28) - 3 miles

A portion of County Route No. 28 from the Gardner Road to the Worth Road.

2. Liberty Road (County Route No. 28) - 2.5 miles

A portion of County Route No. 28 from the Factory Road to the Sears Pond Road.

Town of New Bremen

1. Snell Road (County Route No. 37) - 1.5 miles

A portion of County Route No. 37 from the Benton Road to NYS Route 812.

2. Number 4 Road (County Route No. 26) - 2.5 miles

A portion of County Route No. 26 from the Erie Canal Road eastward to the Town line.

3. Kirscherville Road (County Route No. 24) - 2.75 miles

A portion of County Route No. 24 from Erie Canal Road to Village of Croghan.

Town of Pinckney

1. 7 x 9 Road (County Route 21) - 2 miles

A portion of County Route No. 21 from New York State Route 177 to the County line.

2. Whitesville Road (County Route No. 21) - 3 miles

A portion of County Route No. 21 from New York State Route 177 to the Cronk and Corey Roads.

Town of Turin

1. Houseville Road (County Route No. 34) - 2.5 miles

A portion of County Route No. 34 from New York State Route 26 to the Duncan Road.

2. Burdicks Crossing (County Route No. 36) - 1.5 miles

A portion of County Route No. 36 from New York State Route 12 to the Town line.

3. Lee Road (County Route No. 43) - 1.5 miles

A portion of County Route No. 43 from the East Road to the Milk House Road.

4. Glenfield Road (County Route No. 41) - 1.7 miles

A portion of County Route No. 41 from the Town line to New York State Route 12.

5. West Road (County Route No. 51) - .05 miles

A portion of County Route No. 51 from Town line to Gomer Hill Road.

Town of Watson

1. Number 4 Road (County Route No. 26) - 5.5 miles

A portion of County Route No. 26 from the New Bremen Town line eastward to the Stillwater Road.

Town of West Turin

1. Mackey Road (County Route No. 45) - 4.0 miles

Entire length of County Route No. 45 from the Highmarket Road to the Town line.

2. Byron Corners Road (County Route No. 49) - 1.5 miles

A portion of County Route No. 49 from the Town owned portion of the Byron Corners Road to County Route No. 47.

3. John Street (County Route No. 48) - 1 mile

A portion of County Route No. 48 from the Village of Constableville to the Town line.

4. West Road (County Route No. 51) - 3 miles

Entire length of County Route No. 51 from Rte. 26 to the Town of Turin line.

5. Highmarket Road (County Route No. 48) - 5 miles

Entire length of County Route No. 48 from Constableville line to North Road.

Village of Constableville

1. John Street (County Route No. 48) - 1.1 miles

A portion of County Route No. 48 from the southern village limit to the northern village limit.

SECTION V. CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS.

All of the conditions, restrictions, rules and regulations contained in or adopted pursuant to Article 48-C of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall apply with respect to the operation of ATV's within the areas designated in the preceding Section IV.
